FBI LEOKA Officer Safety & Street Survival Training Course Description

The International Association of Chiefs of Police, in collaboration with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, will host a no-cost one day training for law enforcement officers, command staff, trainers, and personnel **prior to the start of IACP 2012**.

This training features the FBI's Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted (LEOKA) program, a nation-wide law enforcement safety initiative. The program is based on more than twenty-years of research and is designed to assist law enforcement managers, trainers, and personnel in the identification of training issues to prevent deaths and/or serious injuries involving law enforcement personnel. The presentation includes review of case studies with video interviews of officers and offenders involved in violent encounter situations (8:00 am-2:30 pm).

The presentation will also include information on Law Enforcement Online (LEO), an information sharing suite of products and services that support law enforcement investigative operations, intelligence activities, secure electronic communications, online law enforcement training and information sharing. The two-hour course will introduce attendees to the LEO network and identify many of the most significant and popular products (2:30pm – 4:30 pm).
